Our Super G expands the length of the mountain running from the very top of Coronet Peak to the bottom of our Rocky Gully T-Bar. Race Arena is located on the skiers left side of the T-bar and is noted for its pitch.

# Rules, Entry Criteria, Awards

### Quotas

## Sanctioning

The alpine ski racing events are sanctioned at FIS Continental Cup level. Athletes must have a valid FIS license to compete.

## Rules & eligibility

Refer to the FIS Alpine ANC Rules. There is a maximum point restriction to enter in these events.

### Cancellation

A 100% refund of entry fees and unused lift tickets is offered if we call off the race the day prior or we are unable to start the race. Refunds will only be given for payments made by credit card.

#### Rescue and Medical Services

Coronet Peak Ski Patrol and a doctor will be on site for the duration of the event. A medical plan will be available at the first TCM.

#### Awards

Medal ceremonies will take place on mountain at the end of each competition final. Podium placing athletes are obliged to attend prizegiving ceremonies and should make themselves available for media interviews and athlete signings immediately after the awards.

### Lift Tickets

Upon the receival of an email confirmation of entry, directions will be sent on how to pay for entries and lift tickets online. Lift ticket purchases online are for athletes only. All athlete passes are 50% discount from a full day pass. One free coach pass is offered per six athletes. Extra coach passes are available at athlete prices.

Do not use the link to purchase coach and officials passes please email to <a href="race@coronetpeak.co.nz">race@coronetpeak.co.nz</a> the names, birthdate and contact (email or number) of the coaches so we can preprint passes to be picked up at Guest Services. You will then be responsible to pay for the passes the day prior to the race.

#### Bibs

Bibs will be distributed at the Team Captain's Meetings. A bib deposit of \$100 per team or \$20 per individual, in cash, will be collected at the first TCM. The deposit will be refunded once all team bibs have been returned.











# Liability & Visas

### Visas

New Zealand has a special policy for athletes, coaches, administrators, officials and support staff visiting the country to participate in sporting events. Please check with Immigration NZ to find out if visitors from your country require a visitor visa to enter New Zealand. Information and application forms for visitor visas are available on <a href="https://www.immigration.govt.nz">www.immigration.govt.nz</a> or from New Zealand and Australian Consulates, Embassies or High Commissions.

## Liability & Insurance

All athletes, officials and members of the National Associations who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk. Coronet Peak, Winter Games NZ, sponsors and suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers shall not be responsible for any losses or injuries incurred or suffered by the athletes, official or other person in conjunction with the organizing or staging of the event. Liability insurance is lodged with Snowsports NZ for the organisation of this event.

If you are injured in New Zealand (including whilst competing in a competition), you may need the assistance of the Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC), New Zealand's accident compensation scheme. ACC helps pay for your care.

Meaning paying towards the cost of your treatment and helping your recovery while you remain in New Zealand. ACC will not cover any medical or related costs arising from the accident after you leave New Zealand. You will still need to arrange your own travel and medical insurance. New Zealand's medical facilities are not free for visitors except as a result of an accident but even in the case of an accident, surcharges in private facilities apply.

### Travel

Queenstown International Airport is located centrally within the Wakatipu Basin just six kilometres from the town centre.
